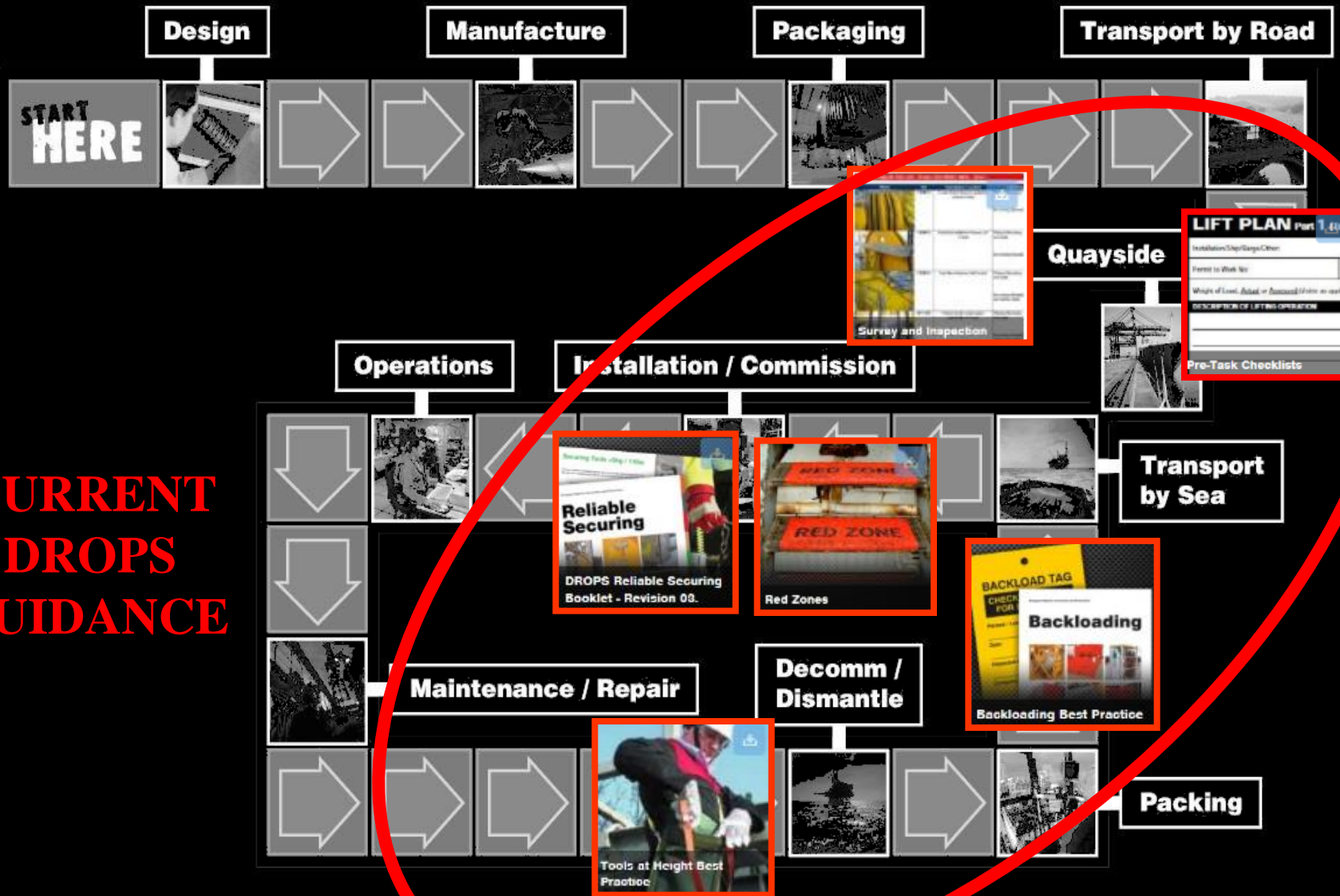




Existing Supply Chain Roadmap

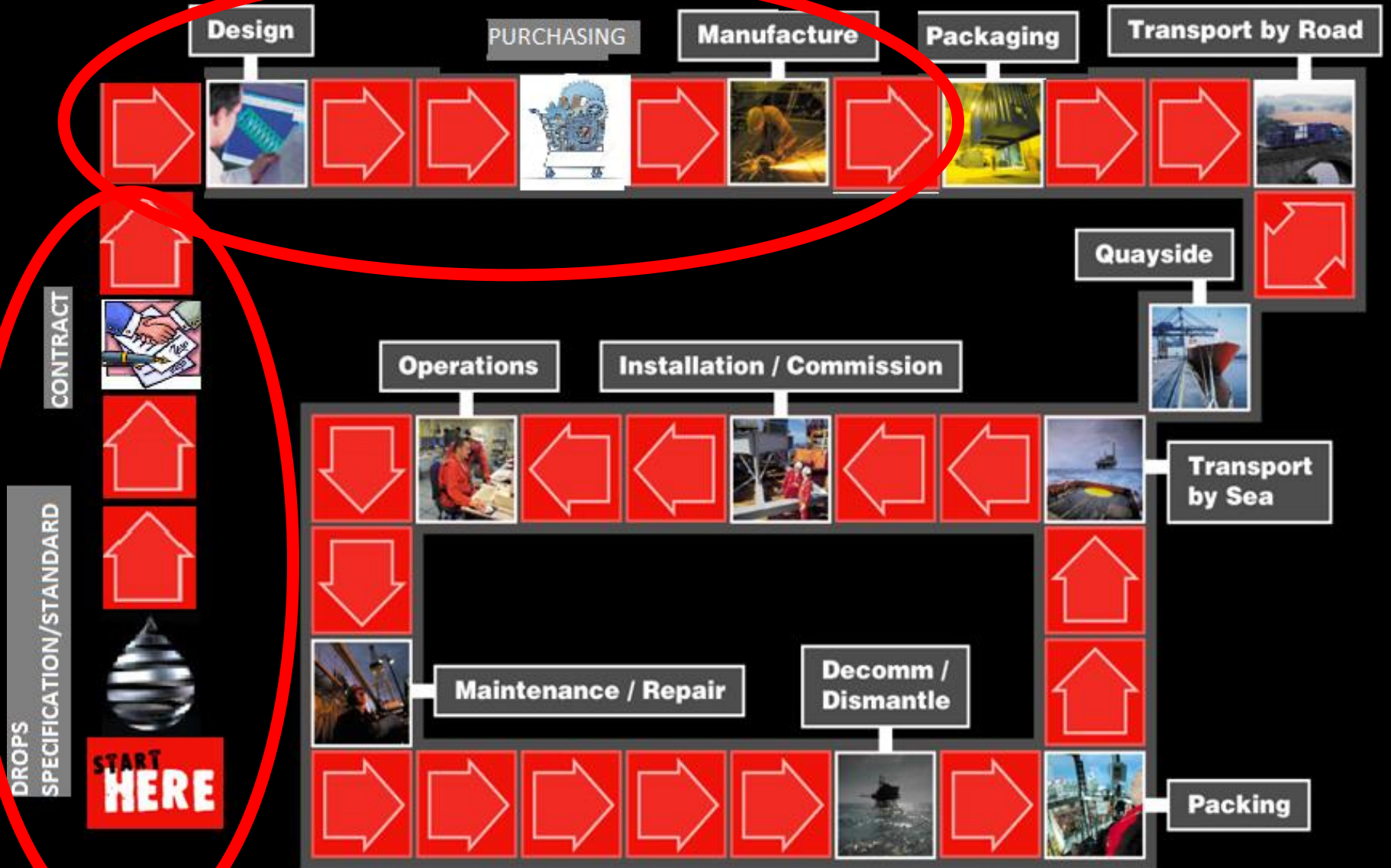

Supply Chain DROPS roles and responsibilities



CONTRACT / PROJECT:

- Awareness of DROPS
- Communicate with Customers about DROPS requirements and DROPS standards
- Issue Customer requirements to Design & Engineering departments
- Assess and identify any potential price impact for the Contract



Supply Chain DROPS roles and responsibilities



ENGINEERING / DESIGN:

- Awareness of DROPS
- Create proper technical documentation
- Include DROPS details into design
- Use DROPS compliant 3rd party equipment



Supply Chain DROPS roles and responsibilities



PURCHASING:

- DROPS Awareness
- Communicate DROPS best practice to component manufacturers
- Invite component suppliers to develop and follow DROPS standards
- Follow Engineering specification for the Components
- Choose and purchase components complying with DROPS requirements



DROPs Design Principals for designers to adhere to DROPs:

- These principals will provide a clear set of design guides for designers to design to as a DROPs base case.
- This will ensure commonality in DROPs design.
